

The National March for Life, typically the largest annual protest on Parliament Hill, takes place this year on May 12th to mark the Day of Infamy, when the 1969 omnibus bill passed under Prime Minister Pierre Elliott Trudeau, decriminalizing abortion. Pro-lifers

rally in front of our Parliament building and march through downtown Ottawa, demanding that our elected representatives fight for the right to life of every human being. Parishioners may attend Mass at 12:10 on May 12th with an hour of Adoration following Mass.

The readings for the 4th Sunday of Easter Year C (Good Shepherd Sunday) remind us that Jesus loves the whole world and calls to all people to follow him. In the first reading, Paul and Barnabas are rejected by many Jewish communities they visit and they turn to the Gentiles. The second reading describes people from all over the world worshiping the Lamb of God. And in the gospel, Jesus declares that he knows his sheep

and they know him and they cannot be separated.

God is speaking to us, but we need to listen. The distractions of the world grab our attention and keep us from actively listening to God. We must find places and times of silence so we can focus on God's message to us.

Reflection Questions

- When are some times when I have heard my shepherd's voice?
- What distractions make it difficult to listen?
- Do I believe that Jesus calls to all of us?
