

# Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, friends, Merry Christmas!

We celebrate Christmas, which is the Birth of Christ. He was born 2,000 years ago, so what is the point of celebrating it now? Well, that event is really made present to us through the mystery and liturgy of the Church. Then, when we celebrate Christmas, we are present at the event of Jesus' Birth.

Moreover, we celebrate not only Jesus' birthday but His Birth to us, in us. How is Jesus born in us? That happens when we, like His and our Mother Mary, welcome the word of God through the Church and her Sacraments, we seek to do God's will (Matt 6:10). Thus, we truly celebrate Christmas, Christmas is realized in us when we do God's will when we give space in our hearts to Jesus. How can we do the will of God? In simple terms, God has to give us His grace and we need to cooperate with His grace so that we may do the will of God. As God offers us His grace, we learn about the will of God in the Church; we receive the Sacraments by which we learn to give space to Christ in our hearts; we learn to reject our will in so far as it is indifferent to and contrary to the will of God, to His commandments (CCC, 2083-2557), teachings, and precepts of the Church (CCC, 2041-2043); we reject our sins through the Sacrament of reconciliation and we welcome God's forgiveness and healing; we faithfully receive Jesus in the Eucharist as food that makes Him grow in us; we persistently pray to Him to help us recognize His will in our daily life; we adapt ourselves and align ourselves with the will of God. In this way, we conceive Christ and give birth to Him in our hearts and lives. It seems that this is the ultimate practical purpose of Christ's Birth, that we become and remain God's children not only in name but primarily in reality, as those who do the will of our Heavenly Father. Therefore, may the Lord help us always to do His will, be His children born of Him, the witnesses of His love and truth in this world. Such Merry Christmas to you and your family, your dear ones.
